She received her B.S. in English from Purdue was active in the travel industry for 30 years. She was a member of Philoptochos, served on the Parish Council and was active with various boards and philanthropies. She is survived by husband E. Lynn Plaster; son John C. **Charalambos "Roko" Aliprantis**, 62, passed away on Feb. 27. Fr. Anastasios conducted his funeral on March 2. Interment will be in Greece. Born in Cephalonia, Greece, he received his PhD in Mathematics at the California Institute of Technology in 1973, spent 22 years on the faculty of IUPUI and 11 years at Purdue University, where he was Distinguished Professor of Economics and Professor of Mathematics. Areas of specialization included economic theory, where he made key contributions to general equilibrium theory, and functional analysis and operator theory, where he was recognized as a leading expert in the area of ordered vector spaces and positive operators. He authored or coauthored over 90 scholarly articles and twelve books, including the widely used textbooks Principles of Real Analysis and Infinite Dimensional Analysis: A Hitchhiker's Guide. He is survived by wife Bernadette and children Claire and John Dionissi.
