Today's Liturgical Hymns

RESURRECTION GOSPEL READING: St. Mark 16:1-8

When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices, so that they might come and anoint Him. Very early on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb when the sun had risen. They were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?" Looking up, they saw that the stone had been rolled away, although it was extremely large. Entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting at the right, wearing a white robe; and they were amazed. And he said to them, "Do not be amazed; you are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who has been crucified. He has risen; He is not here; behold, here is the place where they laid Him. "But go, tell His disciples and Peter, "He is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see Him, just as He told you." They went out and fled from the tomb, for trembling and astonishment had gripped them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

Christ is risen from the dead,

When the women with Mary had come before dawn,
And they found that the stone had been rolled away from the sepulcher,
They heard from the Angel, "Why do you seek among the dead,
As a mortal man, the One who exists in everlasting light?
See the grave clothes in the sepulcher.
Run and proclaim to the world that the Lord has risen
And put death to death;
For He is the Son of God who saves the human race."

Kontakion for Pascha

Into the grave You descended Immortal One,
And yet the power of Hades have You destroyed!
And as Victor You did arise, O Christ Our God,
To the women who came bearing myrrh, You proclaimed,
"Rejoice!" and You granted Your Apostles the gift of peace,
And have bestowed, on the fallen, Resurrection.

EPISTLE READING: Acts of the Apostles 1:1-8

In the first book, O Theophilos, I have dealt with all that Jesus began to do and teach, until the day when he was taken up, after he had given commandment through the Holy Spirit to the apostles whom he had chosen. To them he presented himself alive after his passion by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days, and speaking of the kingdom of God. And while staying with them he charged them not to depart from Jerusalem, but to wait for the promise of the Father, which, he said, "you heard from me, for John baptized with water, but before many days you shall be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, will you at this time restore the kingdom of Israel?" He said to them, "it is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has fixed by his own authority. But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria and to the end of the earth."

GOSPEL READING: The Gospel According to John 1:1-17

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God; all things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made. In him was life, and the life was the light of men. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came for testimony, to bear witness to the light, that all might believe through him. He was not the light, but came to bear witness to the light.

The true light that enlightens every man was coming into the world. He was in the world, and the world was made through him, yet the world knew him not. He came to his own home, and his own people received him not. But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God; who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God.

And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father. (John bore witness to him, and cried, "This was he of whom I said, 'He who comes after me ranks before me, for he was before me.'") And from his fullness have we all received, grace upon grace. For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.

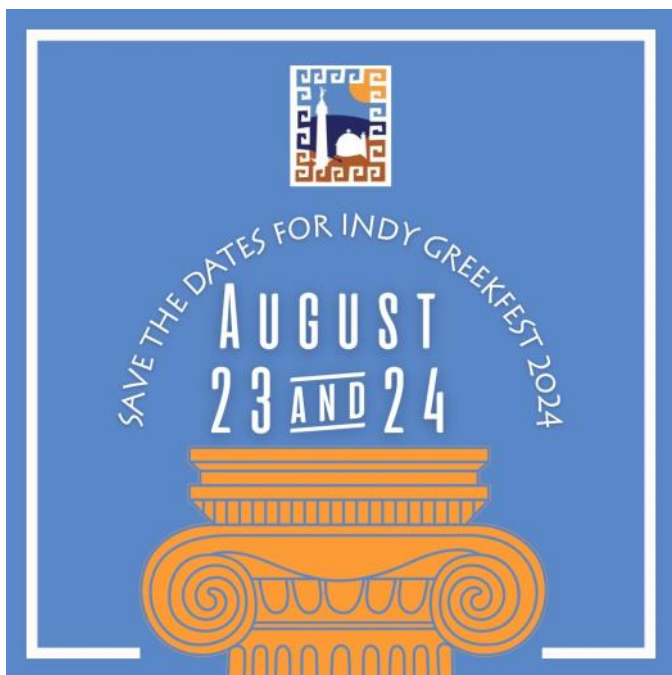

Saint Basil Food Pantry April Challenge

As the journey to Pascha continues and we gather together for Saint Basil’s Liturgy, “Let us give thanks to the Lord” and offer to help those in need. During the Divine Liturgy of St. Basil the Great, the offering prayers include the following, “Remember, Lord, those who bear fruit and do good works in Your holy churches, and those who remember the poor. Reward them with Your rich and heavenly gifts. Grant them in return for earthly things, heavenly gifts; for temporal, eternal; for corruptible, incorruptible.”

The goal of this challenge is to collect and offer food items for those in need. Please consider donating nonperishable food items or making monetary donations.

1. Please collect the following items in canned, boxed, and plastic containers only:

Chef Boyardee (Beef Ravioli and Spaghetti & Meatballs are favorites)

Fruits (mandarin oranges, pineapple and peaches are favorites)
